

# **Trinity Chronicles: A Glimpse Back in Time**

Twenty-four men met on November 9, 1879, to found Trinity Lutheran Church and School, the first Missouri Synod congregation Property Houston. in was purchased in the 400 block Louisiana in downtown of Houston (present site of the Lyric Center) as the location for the first sanctuary and school, dedicated on November 28, 1880. This site was occupied for 25 years when the congregation purchased property at 12 Riesner




Street at Washington Avenue. A school building and brick veneer sanctuary were built and dedicated there by 1905. Through the years more property was purchased facing Houston Avenue and the present sanctuary was constructed and Trinity's address became 800 Houston Avenue.

Trinity's founding member Dr. Henry Nehrling, (1853-1929) was the first church secretary and the first teacher in the school. He was a graduate of the Lutheran Teacher's Seminary in Illinois and taught in Lutheran schools in Illinois, Missouri and Texas. He became interested in Ornithology (birds) and Horticulture (plants) at a young age. This interest continued and was fulfilled in 1885 with the purchase of acreage in

Gotha, Florida, where he established "Palm Cottage Gardens". He became a leading Horticulturist working with the FSDA experimental stations testing over 3000 plants, 300 of which became tropical and subtropical plants in Florida. He wrote books, essays, and articles for magazines and became well known internationally as an Ornithologist and Horticulturist. "Palm Cottage Gardens" has been preserved and continues today as an education center focusing on horticultural and environmental conservation. Many events are scheduled throughout the year for individuals and children to tour the gardens and the Nehrling home. In 2000 the site was placed on the National Register of Historic Sites. In 1917, Dr. Nehrling also established a garden in Naples, Florida, known as "Tropical Gardens and Arboretum" and today is part of the Naples Zoo.

On January 31, 1881, Trinity Lutheran Church purchased property for a cemetery located at 500 Sawyer Street. It was cleared and platted for its dedication on July 24, 1881, located one mile west of Trinity's campus. It currently has remains of some 450 sainted Lutheran individuals. These include the remains of men that served in the military beginning with the Spanish-American War in 1898, and a number of former pastors and staff members of Trinity. In 2013, new fencing, entrance gates, brick columns with signage and paved entry at the main entrance was installed. In December 2014, two Columbarium's were added with vase niches for above-ground remains.

In 1933 a new brick school building was built to replace the wooden structure on Riesner. It was unique in that it had a bowling alley in the semi-basement and a aymnasium on the upper floor. This building served until 1995 when it was demolished for construction of the Christian Life Center in 1996. The school



educational building at 1316B Washington Avenue was dedicated in 2011. Trinity's school was closed in 2017 after 137 years because of low student enrollment. On May 21, 2017 a "Service of Thanksgiving" and Praise" was held in thankfulness for the many years of Christian education provided through the school. The building is being leased to LEAH and they operate the Day-Care Center.

During the early years and into the present, Trinity has been blessed with dedicated pastors and teachers. Trinity's first pastor was the Rev Timothy Stiemke and that blessing has continued through the years with Rev. John W. Behnken, Sr. (served Trinity for 27 years and was elected President of the Missouri Synod from 1935 to 1962); Rev. Oliver R. Harms (served Trinity for 24 years and was elected President of the Missouri Synod in 1962); Pastor Donald Black, currently serving as Visitation Pastor has served Trinity actively since 1958. He became Senior Pastor in 1960 until repositioning in 1997. Since 2005, Pastor Michael P. Dorn has served as Senior Pastor and Pastor Lonnie Gonzales has served as Associate Pastor of Outreach since 2022. Outstanding teachers and principals of Trinity Lutheran School included Emil Schultz serving Trinity as teacher and principal for 50 years (1913-1962) and after retirement continued as a substitute teacher

and school consultant; Teacher Oswald Mueller served for 21 years (1923-1944) and was a noted Entomologist and published a book of poems in 1953 "A Child's Book of Nature Verses" and was also noted for translating "Roemer's Texas" a history of early Texas, from the original German language into English. A member that served Trinity's youngest children was Mrs. Esther Lampp who retired in 2002 after serving as the principal Nursery Attendant for 45 years. To be continued next month.

## Finance Corner - October 2024

...for God loves a cheerful giver. 2 Corinthians 9:7b ESV

Tithes and offerings for the month of August totaled \$140k and were \$5k below our budget for the month. For the year so far, total discretionary giving is \$33k lower than our budget. Summertime has ended with three Sundays of tithes and offerings "missing" from our giving.

You'll recall that we missed one worship service due to May's Derecho, and July's contributions were significantly lower than normal, probably due to Hurricane Beryl's enduring disruption to our city.

Your gifts of time, treasure and prayer are an important way you can participate in sharing the love of Christ to our city, so please prayerfully consider how the Lord would have you respond to our financial shortage. We know many were personally financially impacted by the recent weather events, but if you are able to help us bridge the shortage, your extra gifts will be greatly appreciated!

Our year-to-date operational expenses through August totaled ~\$36k higher than budgeted and were  $\sim$ 8% higher compared to spending during the same period in 2023.

Our Fall Kick-Off was a huge success. It was the most well attended in recent memory. The lunch provided by the Holy Smokers was, as one might expect, world class. The Youth enjoyed wrapping up summer with a trip to Splashtown.



# **Lutheran World Relief**

Lutheran World Relief (LWR) is an organization which works with Lutherans and other partner organizations around the world to end poverty, injustice and human suffering. LWR was created in 1945 to provide relief to Europe after World War II and has continued providing help and support to over 37.3 million people in 40 countries including Lebanon, Ukraine, Chile, and South Sudan. When disaster strikes, LWR provides life-saving relief and support to those most in need and continues long after the headlines have faded, working with communities to rebuild their lives and recover their livelihoods. LWR, along with local partners, helps people to have access to clean water and health care, teaches people about water management, diseases of poverty, and agricultural techniques, and provides people with the skills to participate in the decision making processes that affect their lives. Small-scale farmers have access to markets through LWR such as Fair Trade Coffee and Fair Trade Chocolate. LWR is part of the Lutheran Malaria Initiative to eliminate deaths from malaria in Africa. To learn more about LWR, go to www.lwr.org. The Ladies Circle Ministries members support LWR by assembling the kits of care. The Houston area gathering of the quilts and kits to be sent to LWR will be on Saturday, November 2<sup>nd</sup>.

The Ladies Circle Ministries members want to encourage our Trinity family to make the kits of care. A kit is a simple expression of comfort to those suffering, of love to those in need, and of dignity and hope in the direst situations. Please bring your kits to church by Sunday, October 27<sup>th</sup> and put them in the LWR container in the church office.

### PERSONAL CARE KITS

- 1 bath-size towel (approximately 52" x 27"), dark color recommended
- 2 bath-size bars (4 to 5 ounces each) of soap, any brand, in original wrapping
- 1 adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging\*
- 1 sturdy comb, remove packaging
- 1 metal nail clippers, remove packaging

\*Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing the individual toothbrush in a business envelope; no plastic bags or wrap.

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new or in good condition. Wrap all items in the towel and tie securely with ribbons or yarns. Do not use any plastic bags.

### SCHOOL KITS

- 4 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 101/2"; no looseleaf paper
- 1 30-cm ruler or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other side; pack in a notebook
- 1 pencil sharpener
- 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 5 unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

- 5 black/blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- 1 box 16 or 24 crayons
- 1 21/2" eraser
- 1 sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag, approximately 14" x 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)

Do not add other items or leave out any item listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Remove excess packaging; pack all items in bag and close. Do not enclose the kit or any of its items in plastic bags.

### BABY CARE KITS

- 2 light weight cotton t-shirts (no Onesies®)
- 2 long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- 2 receiving blankets, medium weight cotton or flannel or crocheted or knitted with light weight yarn, up to 52" square
- 4 cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- 1 jacket, sweater, or sweatshirt with hood, or include a baby cap
- 2 pairs of socks
- 1 hand towel, dark color recommended
- 2 bath-size bars (4 to 5 ounces each) of gentle soap, in original wrapping
- 2 diaper pins or large safety pins

Sizes up to 24 months may be used. Varying sizes of the clothing items will make the Baby Care Kit useful as the baby grows. Sweaters with buttons or tie down the front are preferred. Diapers can be made from flannel. Gently used, clean items (no stains or tears) may be substituted for new ones. Wrap items in one of the receiving blankets and secure with diaper pins. Do not enclose the kit or any of its items in plastic bags.

Donated items should not have any religious symbols, messages or Trinity's name or be decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.


