Executive Director's Corner - April 2025

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

"We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over Him. For the death He died, He died to sin, once for all, but the life He lives, He lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus." Romans 6:9-11

Together we have experienced Palm Sunday and the Rite of Confirmation for six of our youth, Maundy Thursday and the Seder meal, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and the joy of Easter morning.

Together we will continue to carry out the assignment given to us by Jesus: *"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."* Matthew 28:18-20



Here is a snapshot of our participation as a congregation through March 2025:

*Easter was March 30th in 2024 and April 20th in 2025.

While we had a dip in some of our numbers for the first quarter we are very encouraged by the overall consistency in attendance and number of first time guests.

Giving to the Home Treasury in March was \$149,244 which is 12% lower than budgeted. YTD giving through March is 4% under budget and 5% lower than 2024's actual.

We are encouraged by the response to the Easter Appeal so far and are confident that God will continue to provide for His people. Pledges to the Special Easter Appeal for the projected 2025 budget deficit are at \$39,710 through Sunday, April 27th with receipts from pledges at \$23,670 and additional un-pledged contributions of \$4,500.

Let's thank God for the resources and continued blessings He provides for Trinity Downtown and ask Him to move and guide each of us to do what we can for the ministry of our church.

Blood Donor Sunday - June 1st

Our next Blood Donor Sunday will be June 1st, 8 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. in the gym. If you would prefer a special time, please sign up online at https://www.commitforlife.org/donor/schedules/drive_schedule/387925 or use the QR code below. While scheduling an appointment ahead of time gives us an estimate of how many donors to expect and the Blood Center sends out the appropriate number of workers; an added bonus is we take scheduled appointments prior to walk-ups.



We look forward to a very successful drive. Double red cell and combination whole blood and plasma machines will be available for those wishing to donate that way. Both count for two donations.

Save time with the DIGITAL DONOR APP. The App makes it easy to find a blood drive, schedule your donation and answer the [CFL Express Pass](#) health history interview before you arrive.



REMINDER!! The minimum donor age requirement to give blood is 16 years old with a parent's permission. Weight must be 122 lbs. (still 110 lbs. for 17 and older) and in general good health.

REMEMBER: One unit of blood can save as many as three lives as it is broken down into three components – red blood cells, platelets and plasma.

Developing a Culture of Prayer: The Region

One of the key initiatives of the Trinity Downtown Faith Family in 2025 is to develop a culture of prayer. A shift in the prayer culture needs four distinct environments to thrive: The Heart (Person), The Home (Family), The Church (Family of Faith), and The City (Houston).

"And when He drew near and saw the city, He wept over it..."
Luke 19:41

Upon Jesus' final ascent to the City of Jerusalem, the Scriptural testimony records that Jesus was filled with the Holy Spirit and emotion so much so that He wept over the city. He was crying out because He could see the spiritual deadness of the city and its coming destruction.

Jesus' weeping was not just because of His foreknowledge but for the lostness of the people within the city. His emotions are a feeling of grief for the fate of the city because we know that the heart of God is for all people to be saved. (2 Peter 3:9)

Houston continues to lead in growth among cities in Texas. As of December 2024, the Houston metropolitan area is estimated to have 2.3 million people and in Harris County 4.9 million people. Trinity Downtown is located at the epicenter of this regional growth.

In the City of Houston, according to research conducted by Kerby Goff, the director of the Rice University Boniuk Institute, the rise of "Nones" has increased from 10%-26% since 2010. In the US, it is 29% of the population. "Nones" tend to self-identify as agnostic, atheist, or nonreligious-preference. One in four Houstonians identify in this way.

This increased decline is a reason to grieve for our city and appeal in prayer to the Lord for the Spirit of God to move (John 16:7-11) in the hearts of individuals. The reason we need revival prayer is because we believe that only God can awaken a heart, but who will weep and who will pray and who will contend for the lost.



Some common barriers to revival prayer in a region are a lack of unity among believers in a region separated by doctrinal differences, pride, ego, and comparison. We need leaders in the region to care about something bigger than themselves and desire unity over personal preferences. We need a new wind of leadership that is willing to invest, interact, and invite others to join together in prayer for the sake of the City of Houston. According to Sam Gibson, regional director of Pray NYC, "The Kingdom moves at the pace of relationships."

Intentionally cultivating relationships with unity in mind coupled with a hunger to see God move again and a community willing to break ground for new growth in a prayer room while waiting expectantly for God to move is what a regional prayer culture looks like.

Hey, Trinity Families!


April was AWESOME! Our youth had an awesome time Go Karting and the leadership team began planning for next year! We had the best time during Confirmation Sunday, confirming six students!


- \$50 can cover an entire day of meals for one student at our middle school mission trip to the downtown community.
